## **NECAT BRITISH COLLEGE** DISCIPLINE AND BEHAVIOUR POLICY

Every student deserves to have an education in a reliable, safe and friendly atmosphere. Within a "family" of students rules are essential. These are mostly a matter of common sense and ensure the safety of our children to allow every student to work effectively.

#### **General Rules**

#### Students:

- Should respect each other at all times.
- Should respect all adults within our school.
- Should look after their own belongings and school property, without touching/damaging or taking other people's property or school property.
- Should not bring mobile phones, tablets etc to school (if mobile phones or electronics are found they will be confiscated by the class teacher and either handed back to the parent or student's bus driver at the end of the day).
- Should respect their peers and not use verbal actions (such as calling names, swearing or gossiping etc) and/or physical actions (such as hitting, kicking, punching etc) and/or on-line bullying.

#### Behaviour:

- Our aim for students is:
  - o To develop a sense of self-discipline and responsibility for their own actions.
  - o To ensure safe conditions in which effective learning can take place and where there is mutual respect between all members of our community.
- We expect all students to:
  - o Be kind and gentle.
  - o Respect the personal space of others.
  - o Work hard and not waste their or other people's time.
  - o Look after property and other's belongings.
  - Be honest.

#### Reward system:

Our behaviour policy focuses on positive re-inforcement by rewarding good behaviour including the use of:

- Verbal praise individual or class.
- Written form of praise from teacher to parent.
- Written / verbal praise from any member of the Senior Management Team.







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### Sanction System:

Sanctions for poor behaviour follow a strict format which is adhered to by all members of staff and include:

- Verbal reasoning.
- The loss of an activity or play time.
- Being moved away from other children in class and in extreme cases being removed to another class or sent to see the Head Teacher.
- Written warnings.
- Parents being informed at any stage of the child's behaviour in school or when out at play. They will not be informed of every incident or "offence" but will be consulted if the behaviour is repeated or of a serious nature.
